Our bank loan with Bryant Bank is \$600,000. Full mortgage payments begin in March, 2012 which will be \$5,229.00 per month/\$62,748.00 annually.

The Building Fund is "holding" pledge dollars until such time as they are needed to make mortgage payments.

I think it is important to recognize those silent volunteers who go about their business and accomplish many tasks without expecting praise or recognition.

When the congregation moved to the new church, a fund was established to refurbish and equip the Pastor's new office in the old Fellowship room. Ned Owens, without much assistance, designed and built the desktop/ workspace and shelving from raw materials because the finished desk/work space made of Formica, with the following dimensions, is not available in this area. The dimensions are a desk top/ working space 33 inches wide and 12 feet long on one side and 33 inches and 6 feet long on the leg of the ' L ' shaped desk top and has to be strong enough to support the imposed load of many copy and other machines. The bookshelf is 12 feet long the same length as the desk top.

It is said you can give Ned Owens a chunk of wood and he will make a beautiful book case fit for a President.

Ned cut, fashioned, and assembled the un-finished components at his home dismantled and shipped the pieces to the pastor's office and reassembled them on-site.; finished the wood with stain, and installed the shelving almost single handedly.
